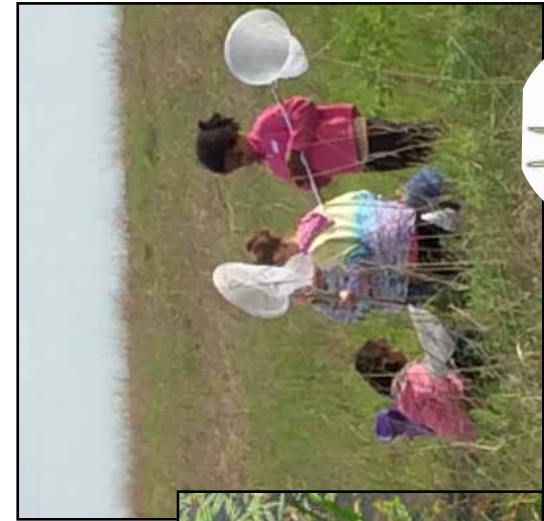
Opportunities to Learn & Explore:
