

Floyd County Board of Supervisors Meeting  
April 5, 2021, 9:00 a.m.

UNAPPROVED MINUTES

The Floyd County Board of Supervisors met in the Assembly Room of the Floyd County Courthouse with the following in attendance: Supv Linda Tjaden, Supv Doug Kamm and Supv Roy Schwickerath.

Kamm/Schwickerath moved to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 3-0.

Public comment: none.

Updates on various boards/commissions/activities: Supv Kamm attended an Area Development Corp, Asset Management, and Cedar Valley Transportation Center meetings. Supv Schwickerath attended County Social Services Committee and Workforce/CEO meetings. Supv Tjaden attended a Law Enforcement Center/Courthouse Owner-Architect-Construction Manager, LEC progress, and Decat meetings.

Law enforcement center/courthouse project: Brian Shindelar, Samuels Group Site Superintendent, provided contractor updates: Dean Snyder Construction is working on door hardware; Young Plumbing is setting in toilets and sinks and finishing up in the floor mechanical room; Young Heating is finishing up duct work by the control station and evidence garage; Paulsen Electric is working on applying lights and devices in the ceiling grid in booking, laundry and corridor G159, TriCity is pulling cable in the server room; Communication Innovators will be working on the door and camera cabling; Jennings Painting is painting doors and window frames in the control station that were re-sanded; Kinsler Insulation is cleaning up areas were they fire proofed joists; Schindlar Elevator should be here this week to install the inmate elevator; Personified Insolation is working on insulating the storage garage; and Sweeper hired a local painter working on sanding the day room areas and will be working on the padded cell. Potential Change Orders include #66 for security ceiling access panels, #67 Security Metal Fences and Enclosures and Security Mesh Enclosure at Large Evidence Storage G202 credits, #68 Additional Bollards at Sheriff/Jail entrance, and #69 Lobby Bulkhead deduct. Shindelar is working on scheduling the parking lot and retaining wall. The recent Dean Snyder Construction change order did not reflect the \$91,000 change order from October of 2019. Communications/Dispatch has likely ordered new furniture.

Tara Studer, AFLAC representative, provided an annual review on products. Discussion included other products available such as dental and vision plans and working on setting dates for employee open enrollment meetings.

COVID-19 Updates: 1) Supv Tjaden commented that this will likely be the last time to include COVID updates on the agenda unless there is a reason to put it on the agenda; information is on the Public Health Facebook page and statistical information is available on the state and other websites. 2) Age 18 and older eligibility for vaccinations opened today. 3) Total positive cases are 1,691, the 7-day positivity rate is 4%, 42 deaths, and 1,616 primary doses, 3,195 booster doses, and 115 single dose vaccinations have been administered to Floyd County residents.

The Board noted the following personnel changes: 1) retirement notice from Ann Marie Sherman effective April 16, 2) hiring of Jennifer Johnson, jailer, starting April 12 at \$16.44/hr, 3) resignation of Larissa O'Connor, Public Health Registered Nurse effective April 8, and 4) hiring of Cody Hanawalt, Custodian, starting April 19 at \$17.50/hr. Supv Schwickerath mentioned interviews for the E911/Assistant position will be starting this Friday.

Future agenda items: Consideration of additional AFLAC products and filling vacancies on the Compensation/Condemnation Board.

Schwickerath/Kamm moved to adjourn. Motion carried 3-0.
